We work with municipalities to offer equitable service delivery to every community we serve regardless of financial means. DRD is responsible for over 30 recreational facilities that include community and fitness centers, sports fields, swimming pools, a golf course and driving range, and various parks and open spaces. In addition, DRD creates and delivers quality programs, services and classes; and, facilitates leisure opportunities through partnerships that encourage residents and visitors to engage in active lifestyles, and develop or maintain healthy habits through recreation and fitness.

FISCAL CALENDAR YEAR IN REVIEW

JULY 2016

- In June 2016, the Desert Recreation District Board of Directors approved Resolution No. 16-37 recognizing JULY 2016 as PARKS AND RECREATION MONTH.

AUGUST 2016

- ASES (After School Education & Safety) opened new programs at Indio Middle School and Harry S. Truman Elementary School, which resulted in over 200 participants enrolling.



SEPTEMBER 2016

- Thanks to our partnership with AAA Southern California, more than 100 teens took part in the “Dare to Prepare” teen driving program.



- Oasis Soccer Field grand opening was held September 8 on the former elementary school site; the District purchased the 15-acre site to build the first and only public park in the Community of Oasis. Read more about this project on page 16.



OCTOBER 2016

- DRD hosted Annual Halloween Carnivals sponsored by Riverside Economic Development Agency at 5 locations including Coachella, North Shore, Thermal, Thousand Palms and Indio – the Indio location had in excess of 750 participants alone.
- A partnership with The Senior Softball League brought 20 teams to Palm Desert, and over 500 guests attended the Desert Rose Society's annual rose show at our facility.

NOVEMBER 2016

- Annual Holiday Food & Gift Drive kicked off; this event enabled us to serve the families of more than 525 children this holiday season.



DECEMBER 2016

- Santa's Hotline gave over 1,000 children from all over the United States the opportunity to speak with Santa, Mrs. Claus and the elves.
- A partnership with the Palm Desert Sheriff's Department brought a Bicycle Safety Rodeo event to life.



- Our joint venture with the Palm Desert Library brought The Chef's Table Cooking Series to more than 200 participants each Thursday, and approximately 120 people joined us each Sunday afternoon for The Sunday Concert Series – both series ran December 2016 to early March 2017.

JULY 1, 2016 – JUNE 30, 2017

- Indio Middle ASES football team won the ASES Flag Football Championship, beating out the other Desert Sands ASES locations!

JANUARY 2017

- The District Gymnastics Academy held their 10th Anniversary Celebration with athletes of all ages and levels performing their skills with over 500 in attendance. The Academy has grown from 40 gymnasts to over 450 and has produced many state and regional champions.



FEBRUARY 2017

- The 17TH Annual Palm Desert Senior Games & International Sports Festival began on February 9 with the oldest athlete competing at age 90!
- 5th Annual DisAbility Sports Festival was held on February 25 and had approximately 170 individuals with special needs in attendance.

MARCH 2017

Partnerships made the following possible:

- Hundreds of prom dresses and accessories were given away to high school students through a partnership with Desert Best Friend's Closet.
- Opera in the Park Festival was a great success thanks to our partnership with OperaArts.
- Friends of the Desert Mountains partnership culminated in another successful event, the Wild Flower Festival.

APRIL 2017

- Over \$23,000 raised at The First Tee® of the Coachella Valley's 7th Annual golf invitational on April 21.
- More than 800 participants joined our annual Eggstravaganza Easter-egg hunt on April 15.



MAY 2017

- Approximately 200 students from our 13 ASES program locations participated in the Red-Hot Ballroom competition, with 11 locations taking home trophies for either 1, 2, or 3 place in one of five dance styles.
- Our partnership with the American Red Cross on their City of Indio Home Fire Prevention Campaign saw 147 fire alarms installed into the homes of residents throughout Indio.

JUNE 2017

- 10th Annual Operation Splash kick-off was held, and in excess of 2,000 scholarships were given out for free swim lessons for children thanks to Operation Splash and our Ready Set Swim! Coachella Valley programs.



- Rancho Mirage Public Library and DRD partnered for their Children's Summer Activities program.
- Our Summer Youth Basketball League reached record attendance with 300 participants having signed up for the league.

ASSETS

While utilizing a regional approach has eliminated redundancy in facilities and several have been repurposed (such as the Mecca facility) to round out our offerings, investment in renovating or replacing aging infrastructure is a top priority. We are also enhancing service areas with the development of new parks and facilities, which is covered in more detail on pages 10-11.

EMPLOYMENT

The District is an employer of choice in the Coachella Valley, providing a collaborative team atmosphere offering opportunities, developing skills, and rewarding excellence. The District maintains an environment of inclusion and respect reflecting the broad diversity of our valley communities, and is committed to recruiting, developing, and retaining the best talent possible to ensure a positive work experience.

INFORMATION SYSTEMS/TECHNOLOGY

The information stations at DRD facilities make access to information convenient, and tasks such as searching our employment portal are easily accomplished thanks to the improved network infrastructure and wireless service now in place. Staff are equipped with mobile devices allowing them to be out in community while staying connected to needed resources for ongoing operations and decision-making.

REPUTATION

DRD is known to use a community collaborative approach to provide quality, barrier-free and safe recreational activities that contribute to the overall wellness of the citizens of the Coachella Valley. The cooperative spirit borne from this approach has made DRD a trusted resource for community services as well as being established as a leader in parks and recreation.

FUNDING

DRD has implemented a long-term financial plan that enables careful financial management, accountability for revenue, spending and public funds, and a capital improvements program that ensures we stay on solid fiscal ground. Additional fund sources such as grants, donations, sponsorships and partnerships are sought out to enhance the funds available for equipment, facilities, community services, and so that we may offer financial assistance to those who may not otherwise be able to participate in recreational activities.

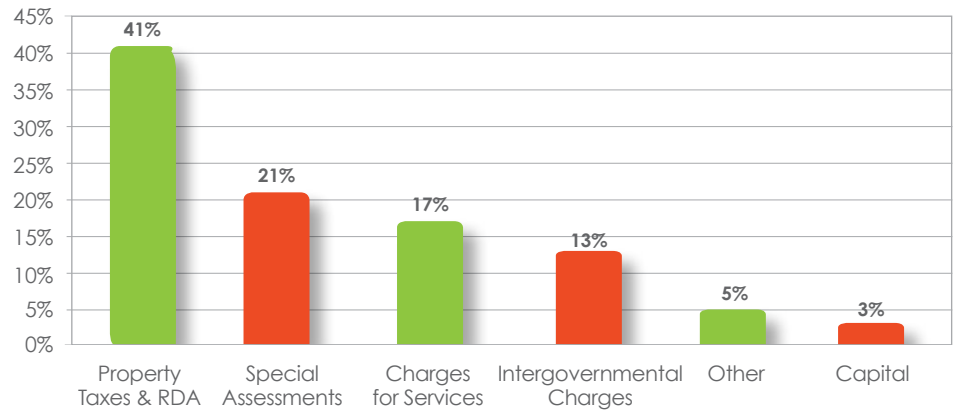


OVERVIEW OF DESERT RECREATION DISTRICT FUNDING



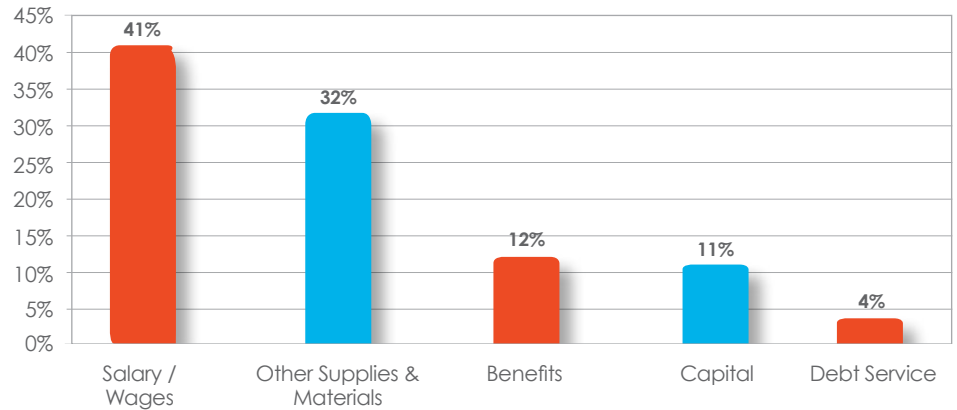
REVENUE AND RESOURCES

DEDICATED PRESCHOOL AREA



Currently, our preschool sits in the front of the building-sharing the main entrance with all entering Desert Recreation District's Palm Desert Community Center. Relocating the preschool to the north-east end of the building offers parents a dedicated drop-off location and a preschool-only playground.

THERMAL LAND ACQUISITION FOR NEW PARK DEVELOPMENT

Desert Recreation District is currently amid a 4.38-acre land acquisition, with the County of Riverside having been the previous owners of the property located on the corner of Church and Olive streets in Thermal. Once the transfer of ownership of the property to DRD has been finalized, the design process can begin so the parcel can be developed into a park serving those in and around the community of Thermal.

NATIONAL PROGRAMS IN THE COACHELLA VALLEY

THE FIRST TEE® OF THE COACHELLA VALLEY



The First Tee® of the Coachella Valley is a program offered through Desert Recreation District and supported by the Desert Recreation Foundation, and it is an initiative of the World Golf Foundation.

Its mission is to impact the lives of children by providing learning facilities and educational programs to promote character development and life-enhancing values through the game of golf.



This past fiscal year has seen two of the program participants be selected to attend **The First Tee® Life Skills and Leadership Academy** in East Lansing, Michigan. The Academy is focused on recognizing and rewarding exceptional teen participants in The First Tee® for their accomplishments while enhancing skills that will help on and off the golf course, and provides participants valuable character education and leadership instruction during the week-long event. Additionally, participants will have the opportunity to develop and hone skills to become leaders in their chapters, schools and communities while experiencing championship golf, career exploration and dorm living.



TRIPS FOR KIDS COACHELLA VALLEY CHAPTER

Desert Recreation District is a recognized affiliate of Trips for Kids® and we embrace the Trips for Kids' mission: to provide transformative cycling experiences for underserved youth. We currently operate the Ride Program for our local community. These programs aim to build self-esteem, inspire healthy lifestyles and instill environmental values.

This mountain biking program for youth from 10 to 17 years of age provides moral support and inspiration, as well as the materials needed, to help disadvantaged kids discover the joy of mountain biking.

Thanks to the sponsorships, grants, and donations received, and the fundraising efforts of our dedicated board of directors and staff, over **\$269,000** was raised during this past fiscal year to help support the mission of The First Tee® of the Coachella Valley.

CURRENT AND UPCOMING PROGRAMMING

ADAPTIVE-THERAPEUTIC SPORTS & RECREATION PROGRAMMING

Throughout this past fiscal year, we have continued to expand the programs available to those with a variety of disabilities. We were pleased to be able to add a United States Adaptive Recreation Center (USARC) SNOW DAY to our lineup this year. Using adaptive equipment and/or teaching techniques, each student was able to discover the freedom of

We look forward to further expansion to our existing program offerings, which currently include a variety of sports (basketball, tennis, archery and more), aquatics, music (drumming), and social skills classes.

People with Disabilities

For the past 5 years, DRD has been hosting the annual **DisAbility Sports Festival Coachella Valley** at our Palm Desert facilities. The event allows individuals with disabilities to join in recreation activities, sports, and see what resources and services are available in the Coachella Valley.



More than **450** kids were taught about basic water and sun safety, canal safety, how to call for help, and more.

As the summer 2017 season began, we revitalized our **Lenny the Landshark** water safety mascot; Lenny received a fresh new outfit, and was featured in our summer television commercial as well as in the coloring book used in our interactive introduction to water safety course at the pools and as part of our camps.

BICYCLE RE-CYCLE-RY!

Through a partnership with Hot Purple Energy, whose mission is to help get the reliance on fossil fuels reduced, we are creating a program where we encourage community members to use the bicycles they have, or possibly donate unwanted bicycles. Any donated bicycles can then be given to someone who is eager to take part in refurbishing them (if needed), and after an experienced mechanic checks the bike out, participants have a new mode of transportation that



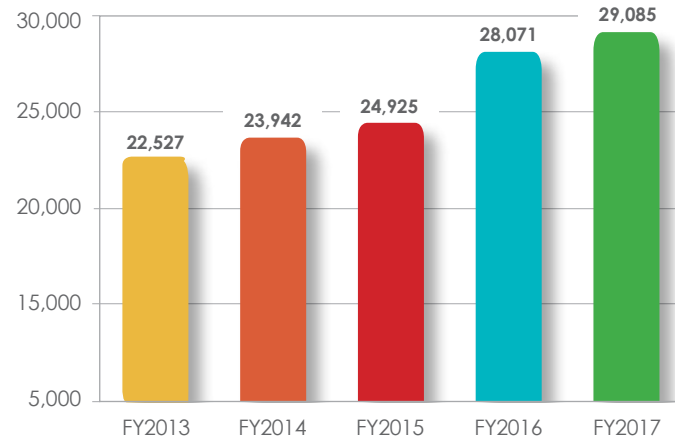

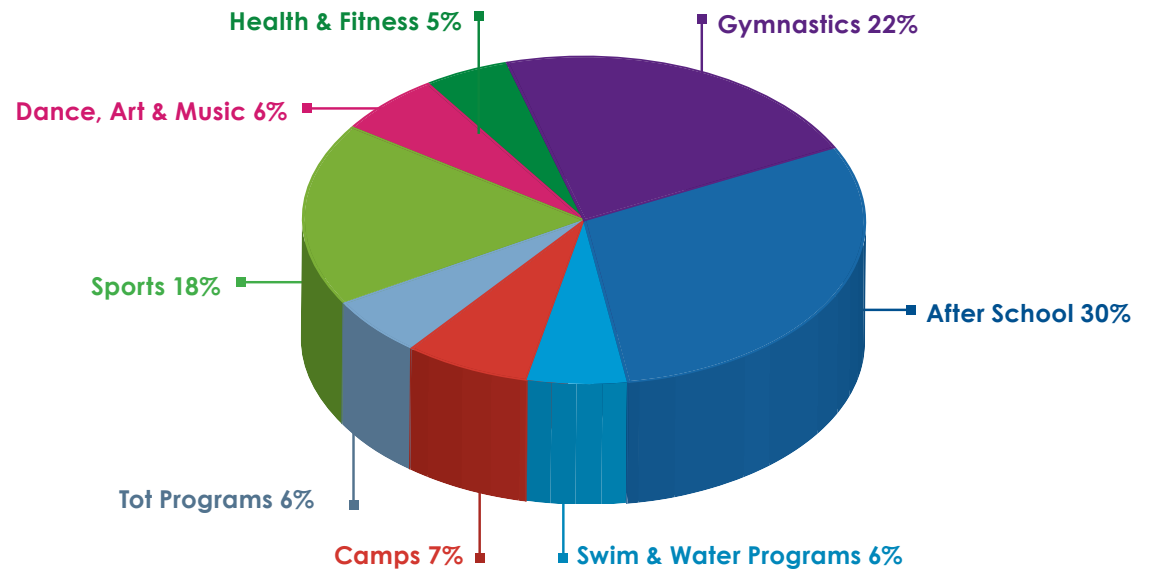


Adaptive/Therapeutic Sports & Recreation

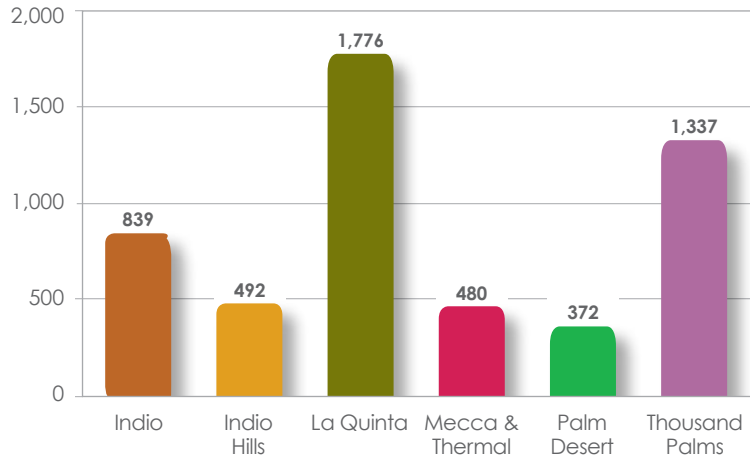

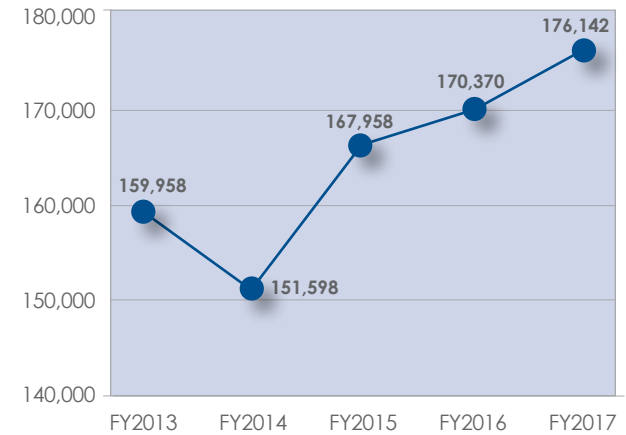
FOOD BAGS DISTRIBUTED IN FY2017
